## 3. Bathrooms & Electricity

#### **Bathrooms**

Smith Porta Potty has been contacted and has agreed to reserve 1 unit for JAFM for every Saturday for the entirety of the season. Buster's Laundry has agreed to allow Vendors to use their public restroom for the entirety of the season.

#### Electricity

When the market was held at the City Park, the agreement was: "If the monthly electric bill rose more than normal for the month in question, JAFM would pay an appropriate amount." To date, the market has never drawn enough power to warrant a payment.



## 4. Weekly Rotations


Preserving the integrity and structure of the existing grass is a high priority to JAFM. The market is proposing to rotate corners of the market each week. This would ensure that the same corner of the grass is given a 3 week break before being stepped on again.



## 5. Sharing Space

There are events during the year that traditionally take place on or near the courthouse lawn. JAFM is requesting to share space and continue setting up. Two important dates to consider:

- Cowboys and Cajuns: Takes place in the evening and will not interfere with market times
- Car show: Takes place on the road on 6th St and lawn nearest 6th St. JAFM vendors can be placed on the far side near 5th St.
